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MOCO DYE PADS



FOR RESTORING CHAFED AND HUNGRY PLACES AFTER SPOTTING AND ALSO RE-DYING SPOTS AND OTHER DISCOLORATION
Fashion Dye Pads Give Complete Satisfaction if Used as Directed Below

DIRECTIONS

1. Choose pad nearest in shade to the color to be touched up.
2. First apply pad gently to the discolored area. Work from the center of the treated area out to the extremities of the discoloration. (Handle similar to the feathering out treatment of water marks on garments.) NOTE: The hand pressure with which the pad is applied by the operator to the material governs the intensity or depth of shade given to the discoloration. Hence a pad applied lightly gives a little color whereas a pad applied heavily gives a deeper shade.
3. If blending is necessary, select a pad of the missing shade and gently apply until color is correctly blended. Thus if dress is Dark Yellowish Green apply a green pad. If shade is lacking in the yellow tone, touch up treated area lightly with yellow pad.
4. If too much color is applied remove by treating with some good prespotting soap and a chloroform substitute before pressing, or simply dryclean to remove dye and restart from scratch. NOTE: Pressing Sets Color So That It Does Not Come Out in Future Dry Cleanings. This Is A Great Improvement Over Other Pads.

To Spot Dye

A little practice by the operator produces good results in spot dyeing places where color is entirely gone. Damage claims are thereby avoided and customer good will retained. At first the operator should proceed carefully until he is thoroughly acquainted with the properties of these pads, and learn just how far he can go to obtain desired results.

Directions to Spot Dye and to Color Rayon Materials

1. Choose a pad of the desired color. Next, dampen a piece of cheesecloth with alcohol. Then touch lightly the edge of the pad with the cheesecloth, transfer to it some of the dye from the pad. The transferred color on the cheesecloth is then applied to the area to be treated. NOTE: The alcohol intensifies the dye transferred from the pad to the cheesecloth about 3 or 4 shades, so care must be used not to get too much color on the material. If in doubt. use a lighter pad.

Directions for Refreshing Dye Pads

1. To refresh pads after they have been used for some time, make up a solution of 2 teaspoons of Parafin Oil to 1 pint of Perchlorethylene or Trichlorethylene, etc., and spray each pad lightly. Lay pads down until solvent has completely evaporated.
